Balloo (from Irish Baile Aodha, meaning 'Hugh's townland'[1]) is a small village and townland near Killinchy in County Down, Northern IrelandOriginally a coaching house dating back to the late 17th century, Balloo House is a pub and restaurant, with stone floors and working Aga dominating the historic kitchen bar. It was once a large farmhouse, bought by the McConnell family in 1893, and has been a licensed premises ever since.[3] In January 2008, Balloo House was announced as one of the Bridgestone Guide's top 100 restaurants in Ireland ...
