To the rear of the ground floor, a practical utility room offers additional space for appliances and storage, while a generously sized downstairs bathroom provides a relaxing space with a bath and overhead shower. In addition, a separate cloakroom adds further convenience. A door from the utility area leads directly out into the garden, making it ideal for those with pets or a love of the outdoors.

Upstairs, the first floor offers three well-proportioned bedrooms, each filled with natural light and character features such as exposed beams and charming cottage-style windows. These rooms offer flexibility for use as bedrooms, guest accommodation, or even a home office or hobby room.

Externally, the property boasts an impressive rear garden measuring over 100 feet in length. Predominantly laid to lawn, this peaceful outdoor space is ideal for both relaxing and entertaining. Nestled in the heart of the tranquil Devonshire countryside, the village of Bere Alston has been designated a World Heritage Site, thanks to its rich history and picturesque setting. Tucked away from major roads, this charming village offers a peaceful lifestyle with the rare benefit of its own local railway station. Part of the scenic Tamar Valley Line, the station provides direct connections to the riverside villages of Bere Ferrers and Calstock, and reaches Plymouth City in around 20 minutes.

The village is well-served by a range of local amenities, including a post office with a bakery, two small supermarkets, a butcher, hairdresser, café/restaurant, takeaway, pharmacy, doctors' surgery, primary school, public house, regular bus services, and a petrol station with garage.

Bere Alston lies just 15 minutes by car from both Tavistock and Yelverton, and approximately an hour from Exeter. Surrounded by rolling fields crisscrossed with public footpaths, the area offers stunning walks and panoramic views of the River Tamar and the surrounding countryside. Located on the Bere Peninsula—shaped by the Rivers Tavy and Tamar—this secluded area is steeped in history and natural beauty. The nearby villages of Bere Ferrers and Weir Quay provide access to public slipways and boatyards, as well as a thriving gig rowing club and a range of outdoor pursuits.

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
